Wade Payne is an independent photographer with over 30 years of experience as a contract photographer for the Associated Press, Reuters, European Press Agency, Washington Post, USA TODAY, and many other news outlets.

His publication credits include Sports Illustrated magazine, ESPN the Magazine, the Washington Post and Washington Post Magazine, the New York Times, Athlon Sports magazine, and others around the world.

Wade's portrait of NBA Hall of Fame player Earl Francis Lloyd, the first African-American to play in the National Basketball Association, hung in the office of former President of the United States Barack Obama, the National Civil Rights Museum, the Library of Congress, and the Smithsonian. It is in the National Basketball Association Hall of Fame and the corporate offices of the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

Wade is a charter member of SANP.




